The Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Environmental Humanities provides a foundation for interdisciplinary thinking. The aims of the certificate are to prepare students in disciplinary humanities degrees for interdisciplinary environmental work in cultural fields. Students take classes from the Department of Geography, Environment, and Sustainability along with electives from two humanities departments. The Environmental Humanities certificate is run through the Environment and Sustainability Program and developed in conjunction with the M.S. in Sustainability and Environment, <https://ges.uncg.edu/msse/>.
